#### Preamble:

#### Attainment of POs & PSOs:

Programme Outcomes (PO), and Course Outcomes (COs) of Various departments are measured through the performance in curricular and co-curricular activities of the students. Depending on the nature of the course taken, some of the methods employed for measuring the attainment level of Programme Outcomes of the students are as below:

#### **Direct Method:**

- 1. The Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and End-Semester Examination (ESE) are the prime tools for evaluation of PO and CO attainment. The CIA matrix comprises of two tests, assignment, presentation, practical's and attendance.
- 2. Experiential learning in the form of organizing events like workshops/seminars/fests is also used to evaluate students' organizational and leadership skills which are a component of PO attainment.

#### **Indirect Method:**

- 1. Student Feedback on Curriculum is obtained and the same is shared with the departments so that their feedback is discussed and relevant changes, if any, are made
- 2. PO is evaluated based on the performance of the students in terms of their progression to higher studies, qualification in competitive examinations and placement.

For every programme internal assessment provides 20 per cent of the total credits assigned for a course. Performance in internal examinations, seminar presentations, assignments and are considered for internal grades. In each semester, assignments are given well in advance and the timely submission is ensured by the departments. Internal grades are displayed on the notice board to ensure transparency and correctness. Students get an opportunity to rectify the mistakes, if any. The attendance element in the computation of internal marks encourages students to attend the classes regularly. In the final semester of the programme, each student has to do a project preferably in association with a reputed organization / company / institute / university. The students are given freedom in the selection of project area according to their interest. Being regular in the classes the students can develop a studious attitude towards learning. The behavioral traits, aptitude for independent learning and communication skill of students are reflected in their seminar presentations and preparation of assignments and creative participation in tutorial sessions and viva voce.


